INTRODUCTION

The 44th episode of Voices of Sustainability, titled "Empowering Sustainable Impact", brought together four of this year's winning organisations from the Health, Food, Water and Climate Action categories to share their transformative contributions to sustainability. The discussion featured Veena Moktali, CEO and Co-founder of Periwinkle Technologies, AbulLateef Olaosebikan, Co-founder of NaFarm Foods, Rhett Butler, Chairman of SkyJuice Foundation, and Innocent Maholi, Executive Director of OpenMap Development Tanzania. These inspiring winners provided unique insights into how their groundbreaking innovations are driving local and global change. The discussion explored the resilience, creativity, and vision required to tackle today's pressing challenges and underscored the importance of collaboration and innovation in creating a more sustainable future.





SUMMARY

The 44th episode of Voices of Sustainability, recorded in-person in Abu Dhabi, was titled "Empowering Sustainable Impact" and was moderated by Shuva Raha, Lead, International Cooperation at CEEW. The panellists shared their insights into the challenges they've faced with their projects, the breakthroughs they've achieved, and their visions for the future of sustainability.

Veena Moktali, CEO and Co-founder of Periwinkle Technologies, highlighted the critical need to improve women's healthcare, particularly cervical cancer screening. She presented the Smart Scope® CX, an AI-enabled handheld device designed to address cervical cancer screening challenges. With 350,000 women dying annually from undetected cervical cancer, her innovation focuses on neighbourhood-level screening,

After working in advanced healthcare systems, I realised India was missing critical women's health infrastructure. Cervical cancer was killing thousands, so we used technology to bridge the gap—transforming medical expertise with AI and innovation.

drastically reducing turnaround time between screening and treatment. Her motivation stemmed from identifying healthcare gaps in India and collaborating with doctors and public health experts to develop a technology that can make cancer screening more accessible.

> AbulLateef Olaosebikan, Co-founder of NaFarm Foods, introduced his organisation's hybrid solar food dryers, which are tackling Nigeria's significant food waste problem, where 800,000 metric tonnes of food are lost annually, costing US \$7 billion. His technology uses renewable solar energy to generate heat and electricity, improving food drying and preservation. Starting with small-scale farmers, he evolved the technology through NGO partnerships and expanded to six states across Nigeria.

Rhett Butler, Chairman of SkyJuice Foundation, reflected on the transformative power of safe drinking water. Rhett's innovation addresses the global challenge of safe drinking water, focusing on a low-cost membrane filtration water treatment solution. His unique approach requires no power and no chemicals while removing all pathogens and contaminants. He emphasises community ownership of water treatment units and transparent cost analysis, with a goal of providing safe water to the billions of people who currently lack access.

Innocent Maholi, Executive Director of OpenMap Development Tanzania, explained how community mapping is empowering Tanzanians to address climate challenges. Motivated by personal experience with flooding that affected his family, Innocent developed community flood mapping technology in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

With over 26 years in technology and product commercialisation across the UK, USA, and India, Veena co-founded Periwinkle Technologies in 2013 alongside Koustubh Naik. They developed Smart Scope® CX, an AI-enabled system bringing point-of-care cervical exams closer to women. Veena has driven patent acquisition, regulatory approvals, research collaborations, strategic partnerships, and the product's 2019 commercialisation. Recognised by the WHO as a 'catalytic innovation,' Periwinkle has expanded across India and beyond, reaching hundreds of thousands of women.

AbdulLateef Olaosebikan co-founded NaFarm Foods in Nigeria, an agro-processing company tackling food waste through innovative solutions like hybrid solar food dryers. With a degree in Geography and Environmental Science, he has over a decade of experience in agribusiness. Under his leadership, NaFarm Foods has supported 65,000 farmers and trained 18,000 women and youth in sustainable practices. Recognised by the African Development Bank and the Tony Elumelu Foundation, AbdulLateef aims to expand NaFarm's reach to two million farmers and scale its climate-smart tools across Africa.

Chairman SkyJuice Foundation

Rhett Butler is the Founder and Chairman of SkyJuice Foundation, an Australian nonprofit providing sustainable water solutions to over 75 countries. Since 1996, SkyJuice has deployed 9,500 water filtration units, working with NGOs like Rotary, Oxfam, and World Vision. With over 40 years of experience in the water industry, Rhett holds postgraduate degrees in Engineering, Science, and Business Administration. A recipient of the Order of Australia in 2012, he continues to lead initiatives for clean water access globally, combining expertise in membrane technology with humanitarian impact.

Through OMDTZ, he has spearheaded projects like Ramani Huria, which trains students and communities to map flood-prone areas in Dar es Salaam, improving disaster management and urban resilience. Innocent's work focuses on SDG goals for climate action and sustainable cities, and he is an active member of initiatives like Resilient40 and OSM Africa.
